#### Dear Readers,

In this newsletter we would like to describe results of our change process. Our community has become small. Now we see our task in prayer, and in living in our place in the shalom of Jesus. We are very grateful to you for continuing to support us in prayer.

Where is the peace of God in our world? The wars are increasing and, despite all the agreements, are becoming more and more cruel.

In John 14:27, Jesus says to His disciples, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives, I give to you. Do not let your heart be disturbed and do not despair."

Jesus leaves peace to his disciples. This is his legacy to his successors. So how do we deal with our heritage? Are we going to receive it? We can also reject an inheritance. And when we take it, how do we deal with this legacy? Is it a valuable asset for us, or do we ignore it most of the time? Is Jesus' peace a precious commodity that we integrate into our lives, that we reach out to again and again, and that we invest work in?

The peace of God, unlike the peace that the world gives, is not simply the absence of war. Shalom means health, wholeness, integrity.

When Jesus returns, he will provide peace. But through our prayers, through our practical actions, and with the opportunities that each and every one of us has, we can advance Jesus' shalom in our environment. This is Jesus' gift to us, so that we may not become discouraged and our hearts may not be upset. This, in turn, is our gift to the world.
